

CHECKING ICA CERTIFICATES- COMMON ERRORS (QTSOP0029)

Purpose: LaManna Premier Group (PFA) is committed to ensuring that all product delivered meets biosecurity protocols and requirements.

Scope: This procedure outlines common errors in preparation and documentation of stock delivered to Interstate Certification Assurance (ICA) protocols.

Procedure

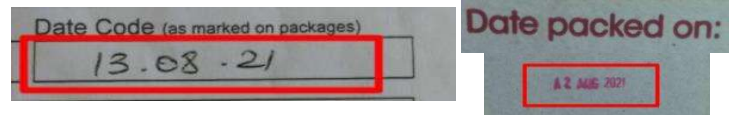
Common errors/issues in delivering stock to ICA protocols resulting in rejections, etc fall into the following categories;

Addresses – Are Consignor/Consignee/Certified business/Packer details all entered correctly?

- Are all addresses entered in full? All addresses should include a physical address (no PO boxes)
 - o Street number, Suburb, State, Postcode
- Is this the correct destination?

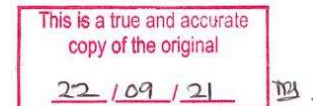
Date Code – Are all dates entered correctly? Expiry date, Date code, Declaration Date, treatment date?

- Do the pack dates include all packed on dates on physical cartons?
- Is the expiry date for the correct year?



Quantity – Do quantities match quantities delivered?

True And Accurate Statement – Do any scans include the 'this is a true and accurate copy' statement, with initial and date?



Split Consignments – Are split consignments ICA-17 stamped, signed, and dated for every re-consignment?

ICA Treatment details – Does the treatment listed match the treatment required/applied?

- Is the ICA treatment listed on the carton-end label?



IP Numbers – Does the IP number of the Accredited Certifier match the label?

Legibility – Are all entries, particularly the certificate number legible?

- Please ensure all copies are scanned in legible quality for all fields



Changes – Have all changes been initialled and dated?
